FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS

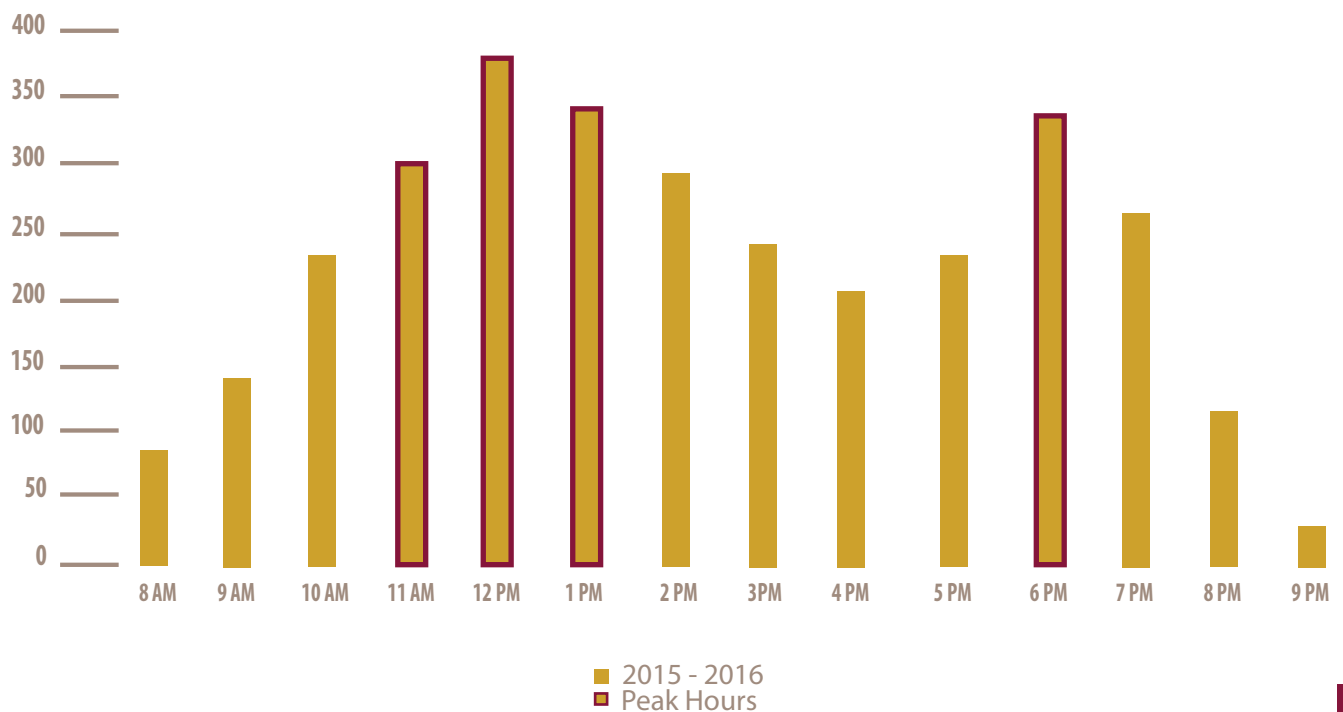
This year, the Loker Student Union made many upgrades throughout the building. Ranging from sustainability efforts, to technological, and building automation. The Loker Student Union made upgrades for the betterment of the students and the environment. This year, the installation of LED lights in all open public areas and ballrooms, were introduced. Also, two new outlets with USB ports were installed in the Pre Function, and South Lounge. Also updated were, 1,000 new banquet chairs, and 10 new split-top tables with lights and power outlets. On the main floor, a new TV/Mediation Lounge was built, so that the students can have an additional space to decompress, and spend down time. Additionally, KDHR Radio relocated to the main floor to have a closer interactive relationship with the students it serves. Lastly, six collaborative learning stations have been placed throughout various areas within the union.

AVERAGE NUMBER OF VISITORS PER HOUR

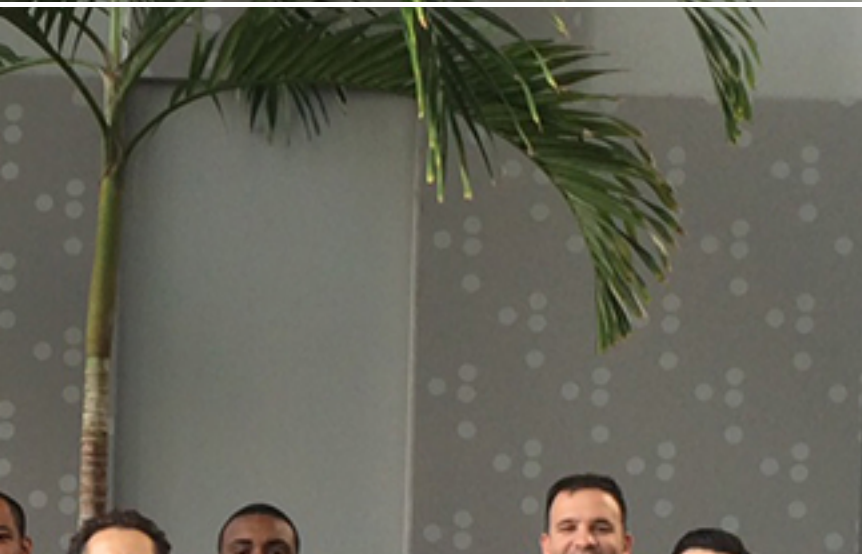

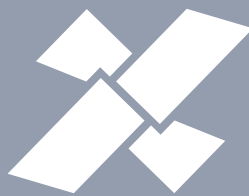
